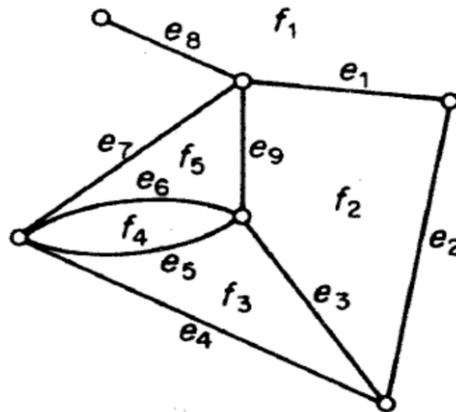
- 2) In any tree (with two or more vertices), there are at least _____ pendant vertices.
